Over 35,000 low-income Vermonters – seniors, children, and the working poor – would have decreased access to Vermont's food shelves.



THE REPUBLICAN BUDGET:

Vermonters Lose.

JOBS

- *Nearly 1,600 Vermonters would lose their jobs.*

VERMONT CHILDREN

- *Over 300 young children would not be able to receive Head Start services, 121 Head Start jobs would be lost, and an estimated 25 classrooms would close.*
- *Over 1,000 children would lose or have reduced after-school programs, and 7 after-school jobs would be lost.*

HEALTH CARE

- *Over 37,000 patients would lose health care they would have received at Community Health Centers over the next year.*

VERMONT COLLEGE STUDENTS

- *13,000 low-income Vermont college students would lose some or all of their Pell Grants.*
- *Over 4,000 low-income Vermont college students would lose some or all of their Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.*
